- Which piece(s) of your armour are missing or loose and how are to "put them on"?

• Read Paul's two prayers recorded in Ephesians 1.15-23 and 2.14-21

- Any significance to the fact that these two prayers are interspersed in the body of his letter?
- In what ways are these prayers similar to /different from the prayers most of us pray

□ PRAY

- Taking our cues from Paul's references to the Spirit and his prayers above, pray that Wellspring, and other churches that might be on your heart, will be:
 - <u>Sealed</u> with the Spirit of wisdom and revelation (1.13-17)
 - <u>Built</u> together as a dwelling place fro God by the Spirit (2.18-22)
 - <u>Strengthened</u> with power in our inner being through the Spirit (3.16,17)
 - Armed with the sword the Spirit—His word (6.17,18)
- Pray for our staff, elders, and ministry leaders as we discern the Holy Spirits leading during this time of transition. **Pray for unity, humility, and love and a growing patience as we wait on the Lord**.
